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1 Nordisk Film & TV Fond

The address of Nordisk Film & TV Fond (hereafter called "the Fund") is: Arbins gate 4, 0253 Oslo, Norway.

1.1 PURPOSE OF THE FUND

The Fund promotes Nordic audiovisual productions of high quality by providing funding in the form of top financing for production of feature films, drama series and creative documentaries.

The Fund also supports distribution and dubbing of Nordic films inside the Nordic countries and Industry Initiatives of professional Nordic importance.

1.2 STATUS AND OPERATIONS

The Fund is a foundation, subject to the legal status and provisions in force for foundations in Norway.

The operations of the Fund shall be carried out according to the latest Statutes and Agreement in force between the Fund and the Parties of the Fund.

1.3 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Nordic Council of Ministers appoints a Board of Directors which bears the final responsibility for the operations of the Fund.

The Board of Directors consists of five board members, one from each of the Nordic countries.

A Decision made by the Board of Directors is irrevocable.

1.4 THE PARTIES OF THE FUND

The Fund's Parties are: The Nordic Council of Ministers

2 General Conditions

2.1 APPLICATIONS

Applications must be submitted via the Fund's application portal: **CLICK HERE**.

Applications with annexes shall be written in Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, or English.

Applications are evaluated on a continuous basis.

The normal processing time for applications is up to 6 weeks. The processing time starts when the application is approved for evaluation.

2.2 EVALUATION

The Fund will undertake a comprehensive evaluation of the project on the basis of artistic- and audience-related criteria, as well as an evaluation of the project's distribution - primarily in the Nordics and secondarily internationally. Furthermore, it will be evaluated whether the economic conditions for the execution of the project are realistic.

The Fund poses no special conditions regarding a common Nordic theme, economic spend, or demands in regard to the mix of the artistic or technical crew.

The Fund will in particular prioritise projects that have children and youth as their target groups.

2.3 DECISION

The Chief Executive Officer of the Fund is responsible to the Board of Directors for decisions made regarding the granting or the refusal of funding.

The decisions are final.

2.4 RIGHTS OF THE FUND

The Fund retains the right to mention all projects that have received funding in all printed material, on the Fund's web site and in social media.

The Fund retains the right to exhibit stills, posters, trailers, as well as excerpts from the project (maximum duration 5 minutes) and other visual material on the Fund's web

site, in social media or in connection with events initiated by the Fund, where the Fund participates etc.

The Fund retains the right to collect information regarding the project distribution on distribution platforms/admissions/TV ratings.

The producer remains responsible for the Fund's use of all above-mentioned material having been cleared with the appropriate rights holders.

2.5 BREACH OF CONTRACT

If circumstances that have been/are relevant to the Fund's commitment for funding are significantly changed, or if the producer substantially does not fulfil her/his obligations in accordance with the guidelines and/or the contract, the Fund has the right to terminate the commitment/contract with immediate effect. In such cases, the Fund has the right to demand recoupment of any contribution paid.

2.6 CONDITIONS FOR TOP FINANCING

The applicant must be a production company which is residing in one of the five Nordic Countries, another EU/EEA member state, or Switzerland, and must have documented experience in audiovisual production.

The production company/applicant must have established a business premise or the equivalent in one of the five Nordic countries under applicable law.

The company is responsible for legal compliance and working conditions, including the prevention of discrimination and harassment.

The company must be the delegate producer of the project. The delegate producer is responsible for the overall execution of the production, which includes financial and creative decisions. The applicant must be able to provide documentation of having entered into agreements securing the above mentioned rights.

The delegate producer is responsible to the Fund for the completion of the production in accordance with the signed contract, and within the guidelines of the Fund.

The key creative forces behind the project, irrespective of nationality and ethnic origin, must reside or stay permanently in the Nordic Region or otherwise have an essential and significant link to and/or importance for Nordic audiovisual culture.

The project must involve special artistic work that contributes to the promotion of audiovisual culture in the Nordic Region.

The project must be suited for cinema exhibition, linear or digital distribution.

The project must be considered by the Fund to have a significant audience potential, primarily in the Nordic countries, and secondarily in the global market.

The Fund does not contribute to the funding of a project that has been pre-sold for distribution in one or more Nordic countries to a media company/streaming service that is not one of the Media Parties of the Fund. Exceptions can be made for projects where the media company/streaming service and Media Parties of the Fund share distribution rights. The rights must then be shared in all the Nordic countries where the media company/streaming service has pre-bought distribution rights.

The first window rights to a production that has got support from the Fund must not be sold to a media company/streaming service that is not one of the Media Parties of the Fund.

2.6.1 Criterias

The Fund provides funding in the form of top financing under the following conditions:

National base funding must be confirmed. National base funding is defined as funding provided by sources in the Nordic country where the delegate producer is established, e.g. national film centres/institutes/funds, regional film funds, the Media Parties of the Fund, and distributors.

To be eligible for funding, the project must have significant financing from at least one of the Fund's Parties.

Satisfactory distribution must be guaranteed in a minimum of two Nordic countries.

For Drama Series and Documentaries, distribution with one or more of the Fund's Media Parties is required.

The Fund cannot provide support for productions financed by Nordic media companies that are not Parties to the Fund, except for productions co-funded by one of the Fund's Media Parties from the same country. The first window must always be with the Media Parties of the Fund.

2.7 RECOUPMENT OF PRODUCTION FUNDING

The Fund provides production funding by way of loans that are repayable according to the following rules:

The Fund is entitled to a share (Recoupment Percentage) of the project's World Wide Receipts.

Recoupment starts when the project's World Wide Receipts have reached an amount defined on beforehand (Break-Even Point).

2.7.1 World Wide Receipts

World Wide Receipts is the total of the project's gross receipts from throughout the world and from all media.

The following shall not be included in the project's gross receipts:

- Minimum Guarantees and presales that are included in the project's financing
- Unused contingency and/or savings in relation to the production budget
- According to business practice: distribution and sales agent fees, as well as expenses for P&A
- Receipts that solely go to non-Nordic private investors
- Ticket support such as "norsk etterhåndstilskudd" and "svensk publikrelaterat stöd/PRS"
- Receipts of remake and merchandise rights

Any repayments of public funding, payments of artistic royalty or coverage of budget overruns cannot be deducted from the project's World Wide Receipts.

2.7.2 Recoupment Percentage

The Fund's amount of funding in per cent of the Nordic funding, minus In Advance Approved Nordic Own Financing.

Break-Even Point for Feature Films and Documentaries: The producer's In Advance Approved Nordic Own Financing plus a surcharge of 35 per cent, plus Nordic TV investment.

Break-Even Point for Drama Series: The producer's In Advance Approved Nordic Own Financing.

2.7.3 Producer's In Advance Approved Nordic Own Financing

The amount of the In Advance Approved Nordic Own Financing for each project is determined by the Fund.

The Fund may i.a. approve the following items as part of the producer's In advance Approved Nordic Own Financing:

- Cash-in-hand
- Labour deferments*
- Nordic Producer's deferments on own contribution*
- Nordic Co-producer and distributor investments
- Nordic Supplier investments

*Note: Labour deferments and producer's deferments may not jointly exceed more than 15% of the total financing.

Own financing shall be risk participation.

The Fund does i.a. not approve the following items as part of the producer's In Advance Approved Nordic Own Financing:

- Distributor's Minimum Guarantee and P&A
- TV investment or pre-sale of distribution rights to a Nordic media company/streaming service
- Funding from regional film funds
- Non-Nordic funding

Request for a change in the amount of In Advance Approved Nordic Own Financing shall be approved in writing by the Fund as an amendment to the contract at the latest before the national release of the project.

The Fund is, upon request, entitled to documentation of all receipts and costs connected to the production of the project, and has the right to audit the producer's accounts as part of the control.

2.7.4 Reporting and Recoupment

The Fund may, as a maximum, be reimbursed the amount granted as production funding.

The Fund's claim for recoupment is no longer applicable to receipts derived after five years from the film's national theatrical release. For documentaries and drama series, this limit applies to five years from the project's first ordinary national screening.

Regular income reports must be submitted to the Fund. The first one calculated six months after the national release of the project, the second one year after the national

release of the project, then yearly, and the last one calculated five years after the national release of the project. The reports must be submitted for feature films regardless of whether the Break-Even point has been reached. For Drama Series and Documentaries only when/if the Break-Even point has been reached.

The reports must be accompanied by copies of relevant sub-annexes from distributor(s), sales agent etc., be properly audited by an accountant, or drawn up by a collection agency preapproved by the Fund.

3 Specific Conditions

3.1 TOP FINANCING OF FEATURE FILMS

Only the project's delegate producer, meeting the conditions in article 2.6, may apply.

3.1.1 Conditions

The Fund will provide funding for the production of feature films in the form of top financing under the following conditions:

- National base funding must be confirmed see general conditions article 2.6
- Distribution guarantees or broadcast agreements must be signed in a minimum of two Nordic countries

Funding applications for direct film sequels will be rejected.

3.1.2 Applications

A complete application must be submitted before principal photography starts.

The following items shall be submitted via the application portal:

- Synopsis (maximum half page A4)
- Manuscript
- If animation: Storyline/drawings/character description
- Length of the film
- Producer's statement
- Director's statement
- Main creative team's CV with residential country
- Preliminary time schedule
- Detailed budget and summary
- Financing plan in national currency
 - Financing plan showing a minimum of 70% confirmed financing
 - o Documentation of confirmed financing, in the form of a LOC or contract
 - Documentation of specified own financing. If deferrals; a list of relevant budget posts is required
 - Other funding the producer has applied for or plans to apply for shall be specified in the financing plan
- LOC or contract with the guarantee of distribution in a minimum of two specified Nordic countries
- Distribution and marketing plan, including platforms, definition of target group(s), description on how they will be reached, admissions/audience

outreach estimate, both in the film's country of origin and the other Nordic countries where the film is guaranteed to be released

- Two of the director's latest/for the application most relevant works (Screening links)
- Visual material and/or other relevant material for the application
- A sustainability plan if the production has one. It will not affect the support decision

3.1.3 Commitments

The producer will receive a Letter of Commitment from the Fund.

When funding is granted, the producer shall upload a portrait of the producer, the main director, the main writer and, when available, stills of the film, including photo credits (minimum 700 kb, .jpg – preferably landscape format and in colours).

After funding has been granted, the production company cannot make substantial changes to the manuscript and/or to artistic, production-related, economic, technical, marketing- or rights-related conditions, unless these have been presented in writing to, and accepted by, the Fund.

3.1.4 Drafting of Contracts

The Fund will draft a contract for projects that have been granted funding. The following items shall be submitted via the application portal:

- Confirmation of all financing in the form of final, signed long-form agreements
 - In the case of financial participation by a media company/streaming service, the relationship between investment and payment for distribution rights shall be specified

- In the case of financial participation by a distributor and/or sales agent, the relationship between investment and Minimum Guarantee shall be specified
- In the case of financial participation by a national film institute/film fund, a copy of the final, signed contract shall be submitted

If updated; Distribution information:

The contract will be drafted upon receipt of all final documentation, and at the latest before locked edit.

3.1.5 Payment of Instalments

Normally the contract will stipulate payment in four instalments.

Before payment of the first instalment, the following items shall be submitted:

- Preliminary edit, at the earliest four weeks, and at the latest two weeks, before locked edit. The edit must have subtitles in Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, or English

Before payment of the final instalment, the following shall be submitted:

3.1.7 Accounts

The Fund is, upon request, entitled to documentation of all costs connected to the production of the film, and has the right to audit the producer's accounts as part of the control.

Cost savings compared to the approved budget will lead to a reduction of the funding amount. This may lead to repayment of already received funding.

3.1.8 Recoupment

For rules on recoupment, see article 2.7.

3.2 TOP FINANCING OF DRAMA SERIES

Only the project's delegate producer, meeting the conditions in article 2.6, may apply.

3.2.1 Conditions

The Fund will provide funding for the production of drama series in the form of top financing under the following conditions:

- National base funding must be confirmed see general conditions article 2.6
- Distribution guarantees with the Fund's Media Parties is required in minimum 2 Nordic countries

The Fund will evaluate funding applications for the first season of a drama series only. Funding applications for direct returning seasons will be rejected.

3.2.2 Applications

A complete application must be submitted before principal photography starts.

The following items shall be submitted via the application portal:

- Synopsis (maximum half page A4)
- Manuscript for at least half of the episodes and storyline for the remaining episodes
- If animation: Storyline/drawings/character descriptions
- Number of episodes
- Length of the series
- Producer's statement
- Director or writer's statement
- Main creative team's CV with residential country
- Preliminary time schedule
- Detailed budget and summary
- Financing plan in national currency
 - Financing plan showing a minimum of 70% confirmed financing
 - Documentation of confirmed financing, in the form of a LOC or contract
 - Documentation of specified own financing. If deferrals; a list of relevant budget posts is required
 - Other funding the producer has applied for or plans to apply for shall be specified in the financing plan
- LOC or agreement with the Media Parties of the Fund confirming distribution in a minimum of two specified Nordic countries
- Distribution and marketing plan, including platforms, definition of target group(s), description of how they will be reached, admissions/audience outreach estimate, both in the project's country of origin and the other Nordic countries where it is guaranteed to be released

- Two of the writers' latest/for the application most relevant works (Screening links)
- Visual material and/or other relevant material for the application
- A sustainability plan if the production has one. It will not affect the support decision

3.2.3 Commitments

The producer will receive a Letter of Commitment from the Fund.

When funding is granted, the producer shall upload a portrait of the producer, the main director, the main writer and, when available, stills of the series, including photo credits (minimum 700 kb, .jpg – preferably landscape format and in colours).

After the funding has been granted, the production company cannot make substantial changes to the manuscript and/or to artistic, production-related, economic, technical, marketing- or rights-related conditions, unless these have been presented in writing to, and accepted by, the Fund.

The Fund will draft a contract for projects that have been granted funding. The following items shall be submitted via the application portal.

Before payment of the first instalment, the following items shall be submitted:

Before payment of the second instalment the following items shall be submitted:

- Written report on the status of the project at the last day of shooting

- Certified accounts showing final spend compared with budget

3.2.6 Credits

From the opening and/or closing credits of the series, and other information material, it shall be evident that the series has been produced with the funding of Nordisk Film & TV Fond.

Credits shall be approved by the Fund, and shall appear on equal terms with the series' main financier.

3.2.7 Accounts

The Fund is, upon request, entitled to documentation of all costs connected to the production of the series, and has the right to audit the producer's accounts as part of the control.

Cost savings compared to the approved budget will lead to a deduction of the funding amount. This may lead to repayment of already received funding.

3.2.8 Recoupment

For rules on recoupment, see article 2.7.

3.3 TOP FINANCING OF DOCUMENTARIES

Only the project's delegate producer, meeting the conditions in article 2.6, may apply.

3.3.1 Conditions

The Fund will provide funding for the production of documentaries in the form of top financing under the following conditions:

- National base funding must be confirmed see general conditions article 2.6
- There must be satisfactory distribution in at least 2 Nordic countries, including distribution guarantees with at least one of the Fund's Media Parties

3.3.2 Applications

A complete application must be submitted before principal photography starts.

The following items shall be submitted via the application portal:

- Synopsis (maximum half page A4)
- Project description/treatment
- Length of the documentary
- If TV/streaming version, number of episodes
- Producer's statement
- Director's statement
- Main creative team's CV with residential country
- Preliminary time schedule
- Detailed budget and summary
- Financing plan in national currency
 - Financing plan showing a minimum of 70% confirmed financing
 - Documentation of confirmed financing, in the form of a LOC or contract
 - Documentation of specified own financing. If deferrals; a list of relevant budget posts is required
 - Other funding the producer has applied for or plans to apply for shall be specified in the financing plan
- LOC or a contract confirming distribution in a minimum of two specified Nordic countries, including a LOC or agreement with a minimum of one of the Media Parties of the Fund
- Distribution and marketing plan including platforms, definition of target group(s), description on how they will be reached, outreach, admissions/ audience outreach estimate, both in the documentary's country of origin and the other Nordic countries where it is guaranteed to be released
- Two of the directors' latest/for the application most relevant works (Screening links)
- Visual material and/or other relevant material for the application

• A sustainability plan if the production has one. It will not affect the support decision

3.3.3 Commitments

The producer will receive a Letter of Commitment from the Fund.

When funding is granted, the producer shall upload a portrait of the producer and the main director, and when available, stills of the documentary, including photo credits (minimum 700 kb, .jpg – preferably landscape format and in colours).

After the funding has been granted, the production company cannot make substantial changes to the manuscript and/or to artistic, production-related, economic, technical, marketing- or rights-related conditions, unless these have been presented in writing to, and accepted by, the Fund.

Credits shall be approved by the Fund, and shall appear on equal terms with the documentary's main financier.

3.3.7 Accounts

The Fund is, upon request, entitled to documentation of all costs connected to the production of the documentary, and has the right to audit the producer's accounts as part of the control.

Cost savings compared to the approved budget will lead to a deduction of the funding amount. This may lead to repayment of already received funding.

3.3.8 Recoupment

For rules on recoupment, see article 2.7.

3.4 FINANCING OF FILM DISTRIBUTION

Only distribution companies in the Nordic countries where the film will be released can apply.

3.4.1 Conditions

The Fund will provide funding for film distribution under the following conditions:

- Films applying for funding to cover distribution costs must have been well received by their respective national audiences in one of the Nordic countries, or must have a significant audience potential within their target groups in one or more Nordic countries
- Funding may be granted primarily for distribution of films in cinema. Digital platforms can be eligible in special areas with limited cinema possibilities
- Funding may be granted independently of whether the film previously has been granted production and/or dubbing funding from the Fund

Funding is provided as a grant, and is thus not subject to recoupment.

3.4.2 Applications

A complete application must be submitted at the latest six weeks before the national premiere.

The following items shall be submitted via the application portal

- Synopsis (maximum half page A4)
- A screening link of the film in the original language, with Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, or English subtitles
- Detailed budget
- Financing plan for the distribution in national currency
 - Documentation of the distributor's specified own financing
 - Documentation of confirmed financing, in the form of a LOC or contract
 - Other funding the distributor has applied for or plans to apply for shall be specified in the financing plan
- Distribution and marketing plan with defined target groups and description of how these will be reached, as well as admissions/audience outreach estimate
- Visual material and/or other relevant material for the application

3.4.3 Commitments

The distributor will receive a Letter of Commitment from the Fund.

Any budget changes made after funding has been granted must be preapproved in writing by the Fund.

3.4.4 Drafting of Contract

The Fund will draft a contract for the film that has been granted funding when an updated financing plan, with confirmations of financing, has been submitted via the application portal.

3.4.5 Payment of Instalments

Normally the contract of distribution funding will stipulate payment in two instalments.

Material required for the payment of instalments is submitted via the application portal.

Before payment of the first instalment, the following items shall be submitted:

Signed contract

Before payment of the final instalment, the following items shall be submitted:

- Accounts showing final spend compared with distribution budget
- Accounts showing total income
- Admissions report
- Evaluation report regarding the reception of the film in relation to expected results

3.4.7 Accounts

The Fund is, upon request, entitled to documentation of all receipts and costs connected with the distribution of the film, and has the right to audit the distributor's accounts as part of the control.

Cost savings compared to the approved budget will lead to a reduction of the funding amount. This may lead to repayment of already received funding.

3.5 FINANCING OF DUBBING

Only production companies that meet the conditions in article 2.6, or distribution companies in the Nordic countries where the film will be released, can apply.

3.5.1 Conditions

The Fund will provide funding of children's films for dubbing under the following conditions:

- A children's film applying for funding for dubbing costs must have been well received by its respective national audience in one of the Nordic countries, or must have a significant audience potential within its target group in one or more Nordic countries
- Funding may be granted primarily for distribution of films in cinema. Digital platforms can be eligible in special areas with limited cinema possibilities
- Funding may be granted independently of whether the film previously has been granted production and/or distribution funding from the Fund

Funding is provided as a grant, and is thus not subject to recoupment.

3.5.2 Applications

A complete application must be submitted at the latest six weeks before dubbing starts.

The following items shall be submitted via the application portal:

- Synopsis (maximum half page A4)
- A screening link of the film in the original language, with Danish, Norwegian, Swedish, or English subtitles
- Detailed budget
- Financing plan showing confirmed financing in national currency
 - Documentation of specified own financing

 - Other funding the distributor/producer has applied for or plans to apply for shall be specified in the financing plan
- Distribution plan with defined target group and description of how this will be reached, as well as admissions/audience outreach estimate

3.5.3 Commitments

The producer or distributor will receive a Letter of Commitment from the Fund.

Any budget changes made after funding has been granted must be preapproved in writing by the Fund.

3.5.4 Drafting of Contract

The Fund will draft a contract for the film that has been granted funding when an updated financing plan, with confirmations of financing, has been submitted via the application portal.

3.5.5 Payment of Instalments

Normally the contract will stipulate payment in two instalments. Material required for the payment of instalments is submitted via the application portal.

Before payment of the first instalment, the following items shall be submitted:

3.6 FINANCING OF INDUSTRY INITIATIVES

Only the organiser of the initiative can apply.

3.6.1 Conditions

Funding may be granted for Industry Initiatives such as workshops, seminars or festival programmes that may strengthen the competence of the joint professional Nordic audiovisual community.

Funding is provided as a grant, and is thus not subject to recoupment.

3.6.2 Applications

A complete application must be submitted at the latest six weeks before the initiative starts.

The following items shall be submitted via the application portal:

- Description of the initiative, which must include its purpose, its Nordic aspect and its main professional Nordic target group
- Detailed budget
- Financing plan showing confirmed financing in national currency
 - Documentation of specified own financing
 - Documentation of confirmed financing, in the form of a LOC or contract
 - Other funding the organiser has applied for or plans to apply for shall be specified in the financing plan
- Visual material and/or other relevant material for the application
- A sustainability plan if the initiative has one. It will not affect the support decision

3.6.3 Commitments

The organiser of the initiative will receive a Letter of Commitment from the Fund.

Any budget changes made after funding has been granted must be preapproved in writing by the Fund.

3.6.4 Drafting of Contracts

The Fund will draft a contract for the film that has been granted funding when an updated financing plan, with confirmations of financing, has been submitted via the application portal.

3.6.5 Payments of Instalments

Normally the contract will stipulate payment in two instalments. Material required for the payment of instalments is submitted via the application portal.
