THE MODERATORS



KAROLINA LIDIN

Our dear colleague, Karolina Lidin, will moderate the Pitch Sessions and guide us trough the event with a steady hand. She has been Nordisk Film & TV Fond's Documentary Advisor since 2008. In addition she is working as a tutor and moderator at international pitching and training sessions, e.g. at Sheffield Doc Fest.

PETER AALBÆK JENSEN

Legendary Executive Producer Peter Aalbæk Jensen will moderate the Producer's Pitch. He graduated from The National Film School of Denmark in 1987. In1991 he started his cooperation with Lars von Trier, and they founded Zentropa Productions together. Since then he has produced and been Executive Producer on a numerous of award winning films like Breaking the Waves, Dancer in the Dark, Italian for Beginners and The Hunt, to name a few.





ISABELLE PECHOU

Isabelle will moderate the Master Class. She is currently the international coproduction manager at Trust Nordisk and founder of The Drama Agency, a Danish consultancy company that sets up Scandinavian fiction co-productions on an international scale, scouts scripted formats and helps companies to boost their international strategy. She also teaches at Serial Eyes, Berlin. She has worked as a TV series buyer then manager of the international fiction scouting TV business in France.

THE JURY



Canadian born Julie Bergeron practised commercial litigation and international financing before moving to France. There she became Deputy Manager at Telefilm Canada. She founded Vision-in-Motion, a company specialising in producing professional events for the film industry, such as the industry programs at the Marché du Film - Festival de Cannes and international projects at Ventana Sur. In 2016, she joined the Marché du Film on a full-time basis as Head of Industry Programs, and contributed to the creation of the Frontières Platform in 2017. She has co-produced Beckett's Prisoners, was associate producer on Regular or Super – Views on Mies van der Rohe and is regularly invited as an international expert by festivals and markets around the world.



MARIA BÄCK

With a background in poetry and dance, Maria graduated from The National Film School of Denmark and was the winner of Nordic Talents 2013. Her debut feature I Remember When I Die was in competition at CPH:DOX and won an Honorary Mention at Göteborg International Film Festival 2016. Based in Copenhagen, she works closely together with Maria von Hausswolff (d.o.p), Julius Krebs Damsbo (editor), Anne Gry Friis Kristensen (sound) and Anna-Maria Kantarius (producer). She is currently writing, with Eskil Vogt as script consultant, her next feature Psychosis in Stockholm.

IVAR KØHN

Ivar Køhn was appointed as Head of Drama at the Norwegian Broadcasting Corporation (NRK) in November 2013, after six years leading the Development and Production Department at the Norwegian Film Institute. Former professional experience includes TV-drama & Film Commissioner at the Norwegian Film Fund, Co-owner and Development Producer at Maipo Film, Head of Development at Swedish Television Drama and Chairman of the Board at Nordisk Film & TV Fond. He has also been a writer/creator for three TVdrama productions.













Juho Kuosmanen started his film studies in ELO Helsinki Film School 2004. His graduation film The Painting Sellers won the Cinéfondation section in Cannes 2010. Along side his studies Kuosmanen also directed theatre and opera. Juho was part of Nordic Talents in 2010. After a humiliating pitch he wanted to die, but as the years went by, he found his way to deal with it. His award winning debut feature The Happiest Day In The Life Of Olli Mäki tells the story of a boxer who finds his happiness after a humiliating loss. The film was nominated for the Nordic Council Film Prize in 2016 and won the Un Certain Regard in Cannes the same year.

LINA FLINT

In 2015, the Copenhagen based producer Lina Flint was educated from The National Film School of Denmark. The same year she produced her first feature film The Elite (directed by Thomas Daneskov) that won the New Talent Grand Prix at CPH PIX. She also founded a new experimental production unit at Nordisk Film A/S called SPRING. She is producing both fiction feature films, documentaries, animation and TV series. Amongst others, The Guilty, that she and Gustav Möller won the Special Mention Prize for at Nordic Talents in 2015. It will premiere in 2018.



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THE NORDIC TALENTS PITCH PRIZE

The Nordic Talents Pitch Prize is handed out to the best project pitched by graduation students during the pitching sessions at Nordic Talents. It is The Nordic Talent's Jury who each year motivates and decides who wins The Nordic Talents Pitch Prize. The jury makes its decision based on the project information sent to them previous to the event, the pitch and the student's graduation films being screened at the event.

> The Nordic Talents Pitch Prize of NOK 250.000 is development support granted by Nordisk Film & TV Fond. There must be a production company attached to the winning project before the prize can be activated. Winners will be contacted after the event with details on how to request the prize.

THE NORDIC TALENTS SPECIAL MENTION PRIZE

The Nordic Talent's Jury also hands out The Nordic Talents Special Mention Prize. It goes to a project pitched by graduation students during the pitching sessions at Nordic Talents that the jury takes special interest in besides the winner of the main prize. The jury makes its decision based on the project information sent to them previous to the event, the pitch and the student's graduation films being screened at the event.

> The Nordic Talents Special Mention Prize of NOK 50.000 is development support granted by Nordisk Film & TV Fond. There must be a production company attached to the winning project before the prize can be activated. Winners will be contacted after the event with details on how to request the prize.

We have invited award-winning scriptwriters Mette M. Bølstad and Stephen Uhlander to this year's Master Class at Nordic Talents.

At Gothenburg Film Festival in February they won the first ever Nordic Film & TV Fond Prize for their script for Norwegian TV-series Nobel.

In Nobel, two stories intertwine as a returning soldier and family man becomes a pawn in a political international game. As the stakes grow higher he is forced to discover just how far one should go in the name of peace. The jury said: "This TV-series has an impressive complexity in the scriptwriting, no loose ends and no inconsistency. There is no filter to the truth. It is so transparent, but still intriguing, raw and honest."

Nobel was directed by Per-Olav Sørensen, and stars amongst others, Aksel Hennie, Tuva Novotny and Danica Curcic. Monster Scripted produced the series. It was broadcast on NRK and SVT and is available on Netflix.

During the Master Class we will get to hear more about their cooperation, writing process and how they develop their characters. Scenes from their works will be presented. It will be a Q&A-session moderated by Isabelle Pechou.

The Master Class will take place on Thursday afternoon.



METTE M. BØLSTAD (1964) is a writer for film, television, theatre and radio. Her writing credits for the silver screen include The Last Joint Venture, Happy Happy and King of Devil's Island. She has co-written three hit Norwegian TV dramas directed by Per-Olav Sørensen: The Half Brother, The Heavy Water War and Nobel. Her recent work include high-end TV drama State of Happiness about the Norwegian oil boom and the feature film Sonja about figure skater and Hollywood actress Sonja Henie – both are currently in production.



STEPHEN UHLANDER

(1964) has since 1995 been working as a translator and writer for film and theatre and runs the London-based company DS Fiction. He co-wrote Nobel with Mette M. Bølstad. He has also co-written the script for Marius Holst's much anticipated drama Congo starring Aksel Hennie and Tobias Santelmann as the Norwegians Joshua French and Tjostov Moland who were sentenced to death in Eastern Congo after the death of their driver in 2009.
