THE FUTURE IS NOW

One of the most exciting times of the year is June, when we at Nordisk Film & TV Fond receive the submissions of the graduation students for Nordic Talents. The interest is always huge, and even this year we received more than 40 applications. Local issues in the film schools may reflect the number of submissions from each country but these trends come and go, and every year we are surprised by the diversity of projects.

During my six years at the helm of Nordisk Film & TV Fond the projects have become more personal. We also see more hybrids between documentary and fiction, and many more drama series suited for platforms and streaming. Moreover, the Nordic region has become more transnational, where young people from different cultural backgrounds choose to cross borders to study their passion profession.


One significant aspect has changed over these six years. Majority of submissions comes from female filmmakers or teams combining both female and male, and this has been reflected also in the selection of the final 15 chosen to pitch. Hearing this genera-

tion speak their mind and present their project has made me very confident in my view that a change in expression, perhaps even a dogmatic change, is really taking place, in a most natural way.

We have experienced many previous Nordic Talents winners from the past 18 years became names in the international and Nordic arena – including many nominated for the prestigious Nordic Council Film Prize – but I should remind that some who did not perform so well in NT have also become celebrated filmmakers!

My message to the selected 15 is that pitching is always a nerve-wracking challenge, but your life won't be over after it! Enjoy it, support and cherish your peers, as making great films and TV is teamwork and a craft that takes time and patience to master.

I want to thank this year's jury, they are not going to have it easy either. For some years we have had the habit of inviting a combination of previous NT alumni together with other more established industry representatives, and this is reflected in our jury even this year.



My special heartfelt thanks go to Benedikt Erlingsson, who has kindly accepted to hold the Master class this year. The talk moderated by the sparkling Silje Riise Næss will be on the use of music this year. Benedikt Erlingsson once said to me that one should not make a film unless there is a message to deliver. Easier said than done, but clearly, this is what he has achieved to master in *Woman at War*. Hats off!

My staff and colleagues at Nordisk Film & TV Fond deserve a big hug

and public thank you for their professionalism and fellowship. The collaboration with the National Film School of Denmark has always been excellent. Together we have been very fortunate in creating an event where students and the professional Nordic industry want to come together. I welcome you and thank everyone for attending — many of you return and that is very valued! I wish you all an amazing 19th edition of Nordic Talents.

SILJE RIISE NÆSS

For the Master Class Thursday afternoon Silje Riise Næss will engage in a conversation with award winning writer/director/actor Benedikt Erlingsson (Woman at War, Of Horses and Men). Silje is a film commissioner at The Danish Film Institute, where she also serves as DFI's steering committee member for the Public Service Pool, supporting drama, documentaries and children and youth content. In 2014, she left the Artistic Director position at Oslo's House of Literature to become Film & Drama Series commissioner at the Norwegian Film Institute. Her experience ranges from art film distribution via head of communication to film festival president. Næss is a previous member of the Nordic Council Film Prize Jury, and is currently president of the Bergman Estate on Fårö Foundation.

THE AWARDS

Prior to the event Nordisk Film & TV Fond invites Nordic graduation students within film- and TV, at BA or MA-level, to apply for the pitching competition.

Among the applicants we pre-select those who pitch during the event and compete for the awards. The selected projects was announced online and in our newsletter in June and are presented in this catalogue together with information about the graduation films made by those who pitch.

THE NORDIC TALENTS PITCH PRIZE

The Nordic Talents Pitch Prize is handed out to the best project pitched during the pitching sessions at Nordic Talents. It is The Nordic Talent's Jury who each year motivates and hands out The Nordic Talents Pitch Prize. The jury makes its decision based on the project information sent to them prior to the event, the student's graduation film(s) that they see during the event and the on-stage pitch.

The Nordic Talents Pitch Prize

of NOK 250,000 is development support granted by Nordisk Film & TV Fond. There must be a production company attached to the winning project before the prize can be activated. Winners will be contacted after the event with details on how to request the prize.

THE NORDIC TALENTS SPECIAL MENTION PRIZE

The Nordic Talent's Jury also hands out The Nordic Talents Special Mention Prize. It goes to a project pitched during the pitching sessions at Nordic Talents that the jury takes special interest in, besides the winner of the main prize. The jury makes its decision based on the project information sent to them prior to the event, the student's graduation film(s) that the see during the event and the onstage pitch.

The Nordic Talents Special Mention Prize

of NOK 50,000 is development support granted by Nordisk Film & TV Fond. There must be a production company attached to the winning project before the prize can be activated. Winners will be contacted after the event with details on how to request the prize.



STÅLE STEIN BERG




CHRISTIAN WIKANDER

Winding, looping, curving, the hypnotising patterns reveal unexpected frictions in the village. Some brand the skid marks as an irresponsible and dangerous act, while others view the mesmerizing marks as a form of art.

With fear of playing with stereotypes: to bystanders, every Icelander seems to be an admirable multi-talent. You are not only a singer, you are also an actor and perhaps an accountant. A top-level soccer player and a high school teacher. News reporter, history professor and president of the republic. You get it. Benedikt Erlingsson came into film directing through acting and stage directing. His feature film debut earned him the Nordic Council Film Prize, whereas his second feature earned him a prize in Cannes last year. Since then, hundreds of thousands of moviegoers have been amused and engaged by a Woman at War.

What is the success recipe? Not to speak of: what kind of cake / film is this really? Deeply emotional drama with a stylistic hint of Greek tragedy? Serious Dramatic bid on Nordic eco activism on film, or absurd comedy featuring on screen musical raptuses à la Emir Kusturica?

Music stands out of *Woman at War*, and will play a central role in the masterclass, as will Erlingsson's slightly absurdist and humourous touch on melodrama. *Woman at War*'s rise to international fame is an example to follow for other Nordic films. It's just that Erlingsson, in all his uniqueness, may not be that easy to follow. At least without following his Masterclass at Nordic Talents 2019.

Welcome to an undoubtedly entertaining, sincere and humorous two hour session, featuring former actor and stage director, current actor, film and stage director and climate activist Benedikt Erlingsson. We present to you a masterclass on the art of being a bit at war with contemporary film conventions and appealing to an audience at the same time. Bonus tracks from the uncomparable debut *Of Horses and Men* may occur.

The master class will be moderated by Silje Riise Næss and takes place in the afternoon Thursday 5 September while the jury makes their final decisions.

BENEDIKT ERLINGSSON Benedikt Erlingsson (born 1969) is a director, writer, and actor.

He is well known as a stage director, as well as for his roles in theatre, television series, and film. His solo performances are some of the most successful in the history of Icelandic theatre, and were performed on stage by Erlingsson himself for six years.

Of Horses and Men – Erlingsson's first feature film as a writer and director – won more than 20 international awards including Best New Director at the 2013 San Sebastián IFF and the Nordic Council Film Prize in 2014.

Erlingsson is a winner of the 2016 Gan Foundation for Cinema.

His 2nd feature Woman at War had its world premiere at the Critics' Week at the Cannes Film Festival in 2018 where it won the SACD Award for Best Screenplay. The film has since then been awarded several prizes such as The Nordic Council Film Prize 2018, Edda-awards and Benedikt Erlingsson and composer Davíð Þór Jónsson shared the Harpa Nordic Music Award.

WOMAN AT WAR

Halla is a fifty-year-old independent woman. But behind the scenes of a quiet routine, she leads a double-life as a passionate environmental activist, secretly waging a one-woman-war on the local aluminium industry. As she plans her biggest and boldest sabotage operation yet, she receives an unexpected letter that changes everything. Her application to adopt a child has been accepted and a little girl is waiting for her in Ukraine. As Halla prepares to abandon her role as saboteur and saviour of the Icelandic highlands to fulfil her dream of becoming a mother, she decides to plot one final attack on the aluminium industry.
